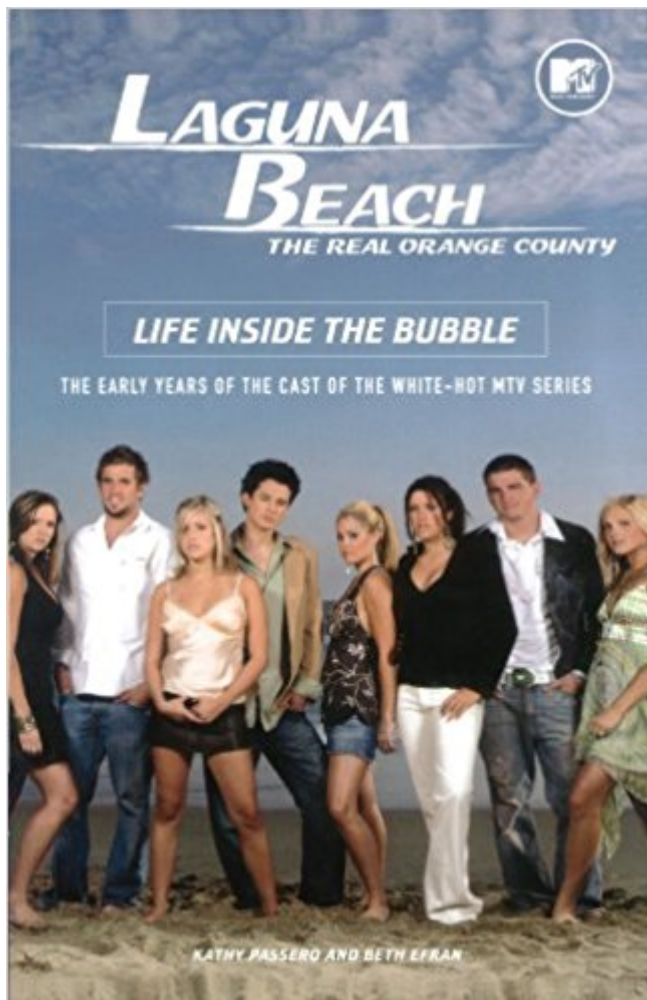

There are tons of pictures inside, but most are in black and white, except for a few glossies in the center section. If you want racy drama, go watch the show, or, better yet, find another novel or story collection.
