

The quality of the pages is absolutely awful. The paper is very thin and the hole punches are very close to the edge. The pages rip out incredibly easily, I have multiple pages that fell out with almost no effort. It is nothing short of insulting to charge over \$100 for this. There is zero attempt at paper or hole punch quality, and I doubt they even care what these reviews say about it. We will all just continue to get screwed over by companies like Wiley

I hate loose leaf books, but what can you do when it's required? The pages keep ripping out of the binder. :-/

The book was purchased in conjunction with taking a college business course. The book is excellent for this purpose and for those wishing to study the topic but it is not a casual read. It is strong on information and communications technology in business that support the enormous changes in this area over the past few decades. It is not so strong on database and other program usage, etc., and I found recommended supplemental readings (from articles older than the date of publication of the book) helpful in studying this area so it is perhaps better as part of an organized course than for self-study.

For a \$120 book, I expect it to be at least bound. How much profit does a company need in order to have enough? College students have it hard enough as it is. In addition to having to pay \$120 I have to go get another binder just to house this book. How much does it really cost to bind a book? It's funny that they can charge a high price because students have no choice but to get the book. Not only that, the side of the pages aren't even laminated so the slightest tug or you turn the page to hard and the page gets ripped off. They say it's convenient for the student because they can just lug whatever chapter they are studying but it's really just for cost saving and profit. I would give this a 0 star if I could. Companies are making absurd profits from the demographic that is having a very hard time as it is. Even then, they skimp on their products. They don't care about the students they only care about the profits.

Go out and get some fresh air. Put down the dry computer material. Do it now!
