

I bought an earlier edition before I went to Cuba for the first time in December 2014 (went back for a longer stay in December 2015). I always tell people that if they have time to read only one book about Cuba before going there, make it Lonely Planet. I've read nearly 60 books on Cuba in the last two years and learned a lot of history, political comment, daily life, agriculture, etc. But Lonely Planet Cuba gives you a little bit of all that, and then some. it is the ONE book you must have. Read the overview in the back, then before you get to a city or province, read that section. Read the restaurant and hotel reviews, even if you're staying somewhere else. They give you a good understanding of a place.

Had to buy this for my class trip to Cuba and I must say it was pretty handy. There is a lot of information and some great suggestions in this book! Some of the best places I ate at or shopped at were in this book. Our teacher suggested this one b/c he said it was the most comprehensive and updated Cuba guide he could find...and he has been studying and going to Cuba for 20 years now.

Initially before I left I was pretty happy with this book, however when put into practice it was useless. Simple information was missing, for example, under "Money Matters" it would have been nice to know that only Visa cards can be used in ATMs, but if you only have a mastercard you can get

money out in a bank. This is not new and pretty important information.

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
