

Go ahead and enjoy doing things even if you're just OK at them, this friendly concept book advises. Lichtenheld (What Are You So Grumpy About?) sets aside the color spreads of his previous titles for simple line drawings based on a visual pun. The book's hero is a little stick figure whose head is the O of OK, and whose arms and legs are the K. (Imagine the word OK tipped up on its side.) The scenery is similarly minimal: a black horizon line, a squiggly tree, some grass. I like to try a lot of different things, the OK figure says. I'm not great at all of them, but I enjoy them all the same. On each succeeding page, the stick figure turns in a series of OK performances, roasting a

marshmallow, cutting a sandwich not really in half (I'm an OK sharer), and looking at the result of his fishing—â•a tangle of seaweed and a boot. One day, I'll grow up to be really excellent at something, OK says, while lying in bed. I don't know what it is yet... but I sure am having fun figuring it out. In this age of skateboarding championships and spelling bee movies, it can't hurt to remind kids that the pleasure we take in simple activities is what makes life worthwhile. All ages. In a world where kids are sometimes pushed too hard to be great at everything (sometimes by their own expectations) this book takes a whimsical look at on'es skills that aren't top notch. And it's OK to be average at something...or to put more energy into a skill to develop it further if desired. What makes this book even more appealing is that the OK is turned on it's side to resemble a human (stick figure) body

that is actually doing all of the activities talked about. Kids love that little twist!

My 4 year old son loves this book, along with Rosenthal's other books. Bought this one used. It looked like it had a coffee stain, or something of the like, on the front, but not big deal. Heard about this book online. My son used to get very upset when he could not complete a task the first time, but we used this book to help him learn that it's ok! He's not going to be perfect at something immediately. It really helped and it's one of his favorite books to read at bed time. He practically "reads" it to me now.
