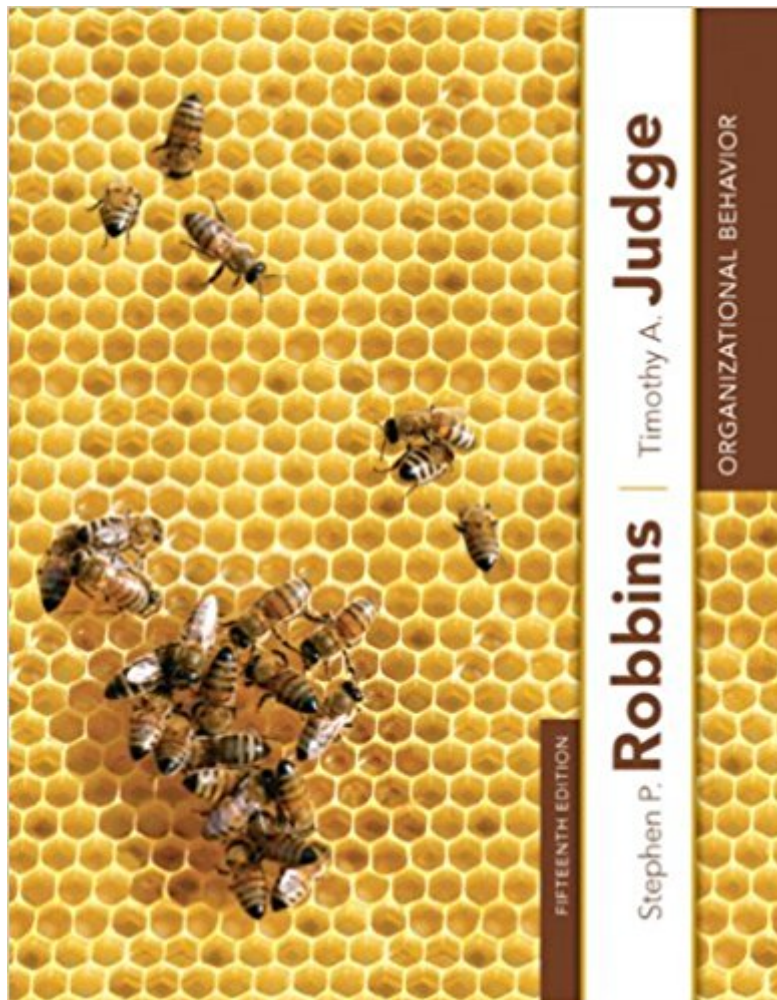




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# Organizational Behavior (15th Edition)

Stephen P. Robbins received his Ph.D. from the University of Arizona. He previously worked for the shell Oil Company and Reynolds Metals Company and has taught at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Concordia University in Montreal, the University of Baltimore, Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, and San Diego State University. Dr. Robbins; research interests have focused on conflict, power and politics in organizations, behavioral decision making, and the development of effective interpersonal skills. His articles on these and other topics have appeared in such journals as Business Horizons, California Management Review, Business and Economic Perspectives, International Management, Management Review, Canadian Personnel and Industrial relations, and Journal of Management Education. Dr. Robbins is a best-selling textbook author in the areas of management and organizational behavior. In case anyone was wondering, the content of the next edition is fundamentally the same. The only differences are the chapter intros and the in-chapter examples. Otherwise, it's word for word.

I attended an Organizational Behavior graduate level program that used this textbook. I was very impressed with the quality and consistency of writing. I have suffered through enough bad textbooks to appreciate decent writing and organization. This was superb.

I purchased this book for a class (as will probably every single person who reads this). There is a new edition for this book, but luckily my professor said it was okay to purchase the 15th edition. Very few things are apparently different from the 15th to the 16th edition, but what those differences are - I don't know. It's a pretty interesting read, especially if you enjoy learning about Organizational behavior. It was a fun class, and I enjoyed reading the book. I thought about giving it 4 stars because... well it's a text book, and I'm not one to say that I "love" textbooks - but it was pretty good for a text book, so I can't fault it for being a text book.

It didn't load properly the first time, and though I could read it on my PC, it stayed in my Tablet archive and would not let me delete it there. I deleted the Kindle program from my Galaxy 10.1 and re installed, took just a couple minutes, and it worked. The book is not set up as smoothly or consistently as most other Kindle books. For example, it will not let you change font or background, which is helpful when eye fatigue sets in, but it will work. There are other minor nuisances but nothing big. I travel a lot, and this is far better than traveling around with a \$200 textbook.

The textbook is packed with real life examples. For benefit of the student, instructions are reiterated, and the author's writing style begs you to continue reading and finish the book. This textbook is a keeper! I have the electronic copy, one minor disappointment, the speech feature is turned off at request of the publisher. At the price paid, no feature should be turned off, security concerns should be handled in another manner. After all, I would use the speech feature for review and

memorization.

Not the greatest, sometimes a little bit noncommittal on what it is trying to say, but a lot of useful conceptual info germane to the subject matter. I bought it used at a decent price and kept it for my MBA reference library. Would not recommend to buy new, but it certainly is okay used at a reasonable price, and probably good to retain as a reference if you get it at a reasonable price for your purposes. Covers the subject matter well enough and thoroughly for a typically fluff subject to begin with.

I am not an expert in psychology, However, being a general manager in a small company, I do need some knowledge about organizational psychology for my work. I am still reading, but so far the book seems relevant to my needs and easy to understand.
