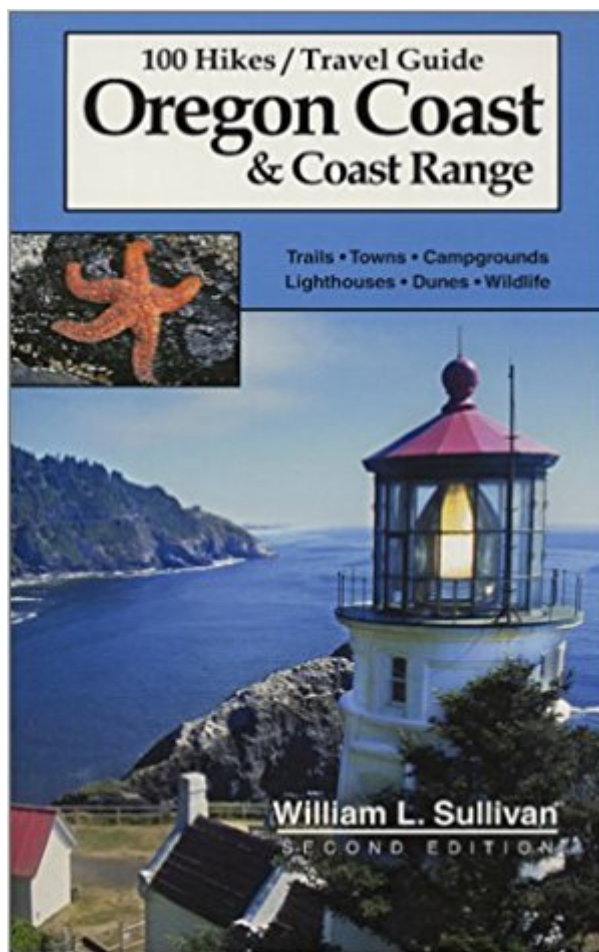

William L. Sullivan is the author of nine books and numerous articles about Oregon, including a monthly "Oregon Trails" column for the Eugene Register-Guard. A fifth-generation Oregonian, Sullivan began hiking at the age of five and has been exploring new trails ever since. After receiving an English degree from Cornell University and studying at Germany's Heidelberg University, he completed an MA at the University of Oregon. In 1985 Sullivan set out to investigate Oregon's wilderness on a 1,361-mile solo backpacking trek from the state's westernmost shore at Cape Blanco to Oregon's easternmost point in Hells Canyon. His journal of that two-month adventure, published as *Listening for Coyote*, was a finalist for the Oregon Book Award in creative nonfiction. Since then he has authored *Hiking Oregon's History*, *A Deeper Wild*, *Exploring Oregon's Wild Areas*, and a series of five 100 Hikes guidebooks covering all parts of Oregon.

William L. Sullivan's travel and hiking guidebooks are fantastic resources for exploring Oregon. I am

delighted that he's made available a Kindle edition of the Oregon Coast & Coast Range volume. I love paper books as much as anyone, and already own this on paper, but I've found it useful on the trail to have the books in the Kindle app on my iPad mini. The iPad mini is smaller and lighter than the paper books, and the content of the e-book can be enlarged on-screen. Most usefully, the maps/illustrations can be double tapped to maximize them to the size of the screen and then pinch-zoomed to make details more legible than those in the paper book. There is some pixellation as I zoom into the image, but it remains legible. Kudos to William Sullivan as well for a pricing model that acknowledges the lower cost of distribution for e-books. If you live in Oregon, or plan a vacation here, you should really have a look at these books.

I've been using the Sullivan guides for years and they've been indispensable to my hiking efforts. With new editions coming out I've started picking up the Kindle versions and having them at the ready on my mobile devices is proving very useful. My starting point for Hiking is in Eugene so for local hikes the Cascades 100-hikes book covers the immediate area and the mountains East very well. This book handles the hikes in the range West of town, plus some good stuff nearby in Corvallis, in addition to many excellent hikes further out at the coast-proper.

This book helped me tremendously when my husband and I went on a trip down the Oregon coast, all the way to the Redwood National and State Parks in Northern California. Great maps, great trail descriptions! Although it is an older book the information was still accurate and very helpful in planning our trip. The author includes hikes and also local sights to see as well, such as the fantastic Marine Science Center in Newport, Oregon, a place we would not have known about without this book. Thanks!

This handy book does a great job of highlighting all possible coastal hikes in this gorgeous state. Even though I only used it for the north coast area, I still found it very useful. The directions are clear and spot-on. I particularly appreciated each hike's ratings ((easy, moderate, difficult) and the options available (if bikes or pets are ok, if there's a parking fee, etc.). If you plan on hiking coastal Oregon, you will find this book to be invaluable.

A few errors. One hike did not tell we were walking through a dead tree forest, results of a hurricane in 2007. A few of the distances of the trail were not correct. Also we found a couple of the mileposts not correct for getting to the trailhead. It did give lots of good ideas where to hike, incorporated with the internet.
