


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# Waking In Time

I received an advanced copy from NetGallery: The first thing that drew me to this book was that it was for teens and involved time travel. After reading the summary, I knew I was going to love this

book. And I did. I felt like I was on a journey back in time. I found myself wanting Abbi and Will to stay together. Great book. Loved it!

Good, clean, fascinating story. There were a few plot holes, like, how did the main character show up in a dorm room complete with a class schedule, paid tuition and friends who knew who she was. Did she take over someone's life? Did they look just like her? There's also the question of the cigar tin. What happened with Will's investment? Couldn't they get their stuff back with their account numbers? Regardless of these discrepancies, I found this story more captivating than most of the books I've read. I completed it in less than a day and wish there was more to read about this story.

Loved this! The setting (University of Wisconsin-Madison) is what originally drew my attention to this particular book. I was curious to see how the U.W. campus was portrayed over the years through Stanton's time travel story. Having gone to U.W. myself (following my mother's footsteps) and now having my daughter attending U.W., I had a very personal connection to the story. I loved how Stanton captured the essence of Madison in each era by traveling back and forth through time. Quick, fun, and entertaining read, a captivating story line, and descriptive historical references, I recommend this book to anyone who loves the idea of time travel.

I am a sucker for a time traveling story and this one was hard to put down. I don't want to spoil anything, but it's the story of Abbi, a girl just heading off to college while dealing with the death of her beloved grandmother. Abbi travels back in time as Will, her fellow time traveler, travels forward. They should never have met, but they have a connection that can't be denied. At first I was not impressed by the plot or the writing itself, and felt there were too many references and quotes from Back to the Future...it was distracting. The more I pressed on, the more I became pulled into the story. By the end I was completely entranced in the tale and have become a great fan of Angie Stanton. As I was busy pre-judging the book, the author was weaving an intricate and exciting plot line with lots of twists and turns, and a wonderful surprise at the end. A definite 5 star read!
